Wouldn't that be about the lowest thing a husband could ever do, to borrow hundreds of thousands of dollars from a man that he believe his wife is having an affair with, to buy horses and dogs? Ask Dr. Yeomans, doesn't that make you something of a pimp?

I do take time to reflect. Reflection is not 20/20. I recognize that my performance in medical school was average and that I failed Step 1 and Step 2 on my initial attempt, but I passed them both the second time with very little effort. I easily passed step 3 again with minimal effort. My General surgery in service exam was in the 20% of the country and my OB/GYN scores were well above the national average. You are the only one I know that still cares about my step 1 and step 2 scores. I think it is because those scores prevented me from doing five straight years of general surgery. I hope you are not trying to embarrass me by continuing to bring up Step 1 and 2 scores. Wake Forest knows that I failed step 1 and 2 on initial testing. We discussed it at length and I explained that it was because I became distracted and did not put in the effort that it deserved. I did very well on the Creog and by all accounts I am an excellent resident who will make an excellent OB/GYN.

You failed Step I and Step II because you put no effort into studying. Rather, you were playing with Denali and obsessed with German Warmblood Sporthorses. You said then that it didn't matter. Turns out it did matter. What you do impacted[s] me, your children and your family.

I recognize that being assigned to Pope AFB for four straight years was a gift. Being able to return to Wake Forest is another gift. The Air Force would not have let me stay in NC and likely would have assigned me to another base for 2 yrs minimum and 3-4 yrs if I did not return to training. I am working toward a retirement and had to go back into training in order to reach retirement. Samara. I engaged in telephone conversations with this woman. I did not do more than that. Yes I can see how the length of our conversations were too long and certainly had the potential to be destructive to our marriage. It is clear to me that you have never been honest about your relationship with other women, including Samara. There was more than just the phone calls, you know it and so do I.
